

CALL FOR EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST VOLLEYBALL – WORLD UNIVERSITY GAMES

The FISU World University Games will be organised in Chengdu, P.R. China, from 26 June to 7 July 2022 by the Federation of University Sports of China (FUSC) and the Organising Committee, under the auspices of the International University Sports Federation (FISU). There will be a Women's and Men's teams chosen to represent Australia.

Eligible athletes must:

- be a national/citizen of the country/region they represent;
- represent the same country/region as in their respective International Federation events.
- be at least 18 and no older than 26 years of age on 31 December of the year of the event (i.e. born between 1 January 1996 and 31 December 2004)*;
**age limit extended to 26 years in order to allow those who met the conditions in 2021 to take part in the FISU WUG also in 2022*

Eligible athletes must also either:

- be a student who are currently officially registered as proceeding towards a degree or diploma at the university or similar institute, the status of which is recognised by the appropriate national/regional academic authority of their country/region;
- be former students of the institutions mentioned in a) who have obtained their academic degree or diploma in the two calendar years* preceding the event (i.e. 2020 and 2021).
**limit extended to two calendar years in order to allow those who met the conditions in 2021 to take part in the FISU WUG also in 2022.*
